

GOLDEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY

ANNUAL MEETING, APRIL 11, 2011

THE ANNUAL OF THE GOLDEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY WAS HELD MONDAY, APRIL 11, 2011 AT THE WINDMILL HALL. THE EVENING STARTED WITH A SOCIAL HOUR AT 6:30 P.M. WITH COOKIES AND PUNCH SERVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

ROGER FLESNER, PRESIDENT CONVENED THE MEETING AT 7:00 P.M. WITH 23 MEMBERS PRESENT. ALL REPEATED THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIENCE TOGETHER.

MARGE SHANK, SECRETARY ANNOUNCED A QUORUM IN ATTENDANCE. THE SECRETARY ALSO READ THE MEETING NOTICE AS PUBLISHED IN THE QUARTERLY NEWSETTER.

ROGER ASKED ALL TO READ THE MINUTES OF THE 2010 MEETING AS PUBLISHED IN THE BOOKLET. AFTER TIME TO READ AND DISCUSS, AND THERE BEING NO CORRECTIONS OR CHANGES THE MINUTES WERE DECLARED TO STAND AS WRITTEN.

KEN FLESNER, TREASURER, HIGHTLIGHTED THE ASSETS AND LIABILITIES AND THE INCOME AND EXPENSES AS PRESENTED IN THE BOOKLET OF THE PAST YEAR. MARGE SHANK, FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN, EXPLAINED THE 2011 BUDGET AS APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S TO THE MEMBERS.

ROGER WENT THROUGH THE BOOKLET NOTING HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS HELD BY THE SOCIETY DURING 2010 YEAR. HE DID STRESS THAT THERE IS A NEED FOR MORE VOLUNTEERS TO BE CHAIR PERSONS OF SOME OF THE COMMITTEES. ONE HE NOTED IN PARTICULAR WAS THE NEWLETTER. ROGER WOULD LIKE TO HAVE SOMEONE HELP WITH THE PUBLICATION SO THAT IT WILL CONINTUE TO BE A QUARTERLY PUBLICATION.

MARK CASSENS, ATTORNEY, HANDLED THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS TO THE BOARD. HE READ THE NAMES OF DON BUSS, MARILEE CROOKS, KENNETH FLESNER, KAY LORD AS CANDIDATES WHO WISH TO REMAIN ON THE BOARD, AND ONE NEW CANDIDATE IN TOM BENNETT. MARK ASKED FOR NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR. THERE BEING NONE, DON BUSS MOVED THAT THE SLATE OF BOARD MEMBERS AS PRESENTED BE ACCEPTED BY ACCLAMATION. BILL CASSENS SECONDED THE MOTION. THE MOTION CARRIED.

ROGER REFERRED TO OLD BUSINESS FROM THE 2010 MEETING. ONE OF THE ISSUES WAS CHANGING THE STEPS IN THE MILL SO THEY WOULD BE MORE USER FRIENDLY. THAT HAS BEEN DONE. ANOTHER RECOMMENDATION WAS THAT SOME OF THE RESERVE FUNDS ON HAND BE PUT INTO LONGER TERM C.D.'S SO THAT SOME INTEREST WOULD BE ACCURED. THAT HAS BEEN DONE. FUNDS WERE PUT IN CD'S IN \$5000.00 INCREMENTS FOR 12 MONTHS, 24 MONTHS, 36 MONTHS AND 48 MONTHS.

UNDER NEW BUSINESS, LOIS REASON REPORTED FOR A 25TH ANNINVERSARY COMMITTEE ABOUT SOME EVENTS THAT ARE BEING PLANNED FOR THE YEAR LONG CELEBRATION. THEY ALSO ARE INCLUDING A RAFFLE FOR A BASEBALL GAME, AND A RAFFLE FOR A GETAWAY IN BRANSON. DRAWING OF WINNERS TO BE HELD IN AUGUST.

AN ENTERTAINMENT PERIOD WITH A POWER POINT PRESENTATION OF PHOTOS FROM THE CONCEPTION AND RENOVATIONS OF THE MILL UNTIL NOW WAS PRESENTED BY ROGER.

THE MEETING WAS ADJOURNED AT 8:15 P.M. WITH A MOTION BY BOB REASON, A SECOND BY EMILY TEEL AND A UNANIMOUS VOTE.

GHS PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Twenty five years! What a remarkable milestone. Has that much time passed already? Much has been accomplished. Many hours of volunteer work was given in planning, decision making, directing, and carrying out the wishes, visions, and desires of those dedicated individuals who established the Golden Historical Society. Many more hours have been volunteered over the years by Board members, workers, friends, and supporters as they directed activities to maintain the facilities and organized and carried out activities. Because of personal interest, dedication and efforts, the Windmill remains a landmark. Its story continues to be told. Visitors are amazed and inspired by the things they see and the stories they hear while touring the museum and Windmill.

A few accomplishments during the 25th year include:

- 1. Repair to the Windmill wings
- 2. Kitchen upgrade by adding a dishwasher
- 3. Replaced Windmill windows
- 4. Improved lighting in Windmill hall
- 5. Upgraded wiring and plumbing
- 6. Designated the museum as ANNA WIENKE MUSEUM
- 7. Finished stage construction
- 8. Additional bricks and a bench added to the patio

Activities during the year included the annual Windmill Follies, Heritage days, Mystery Theater Dinner, Oktoberfest, and Christmas at the Mill. Other activities were wedding, anniversary and birthday receptions, dances, auctions, and business meetings. New activities for 2012 include the first evening of open microphone karaoke night, antique tractor display day and an additional mystery dinner.

An activity of note in Golden during this year was the demolition of the Emminga Steam powered mill. The building was erected for milling and powered by steam, thereby assuring a consistent operational schedule when compared to the wind driven windmill. The original cornerstone and two flower sifters from the mill were donated to the Historical Society by Matt Dearwester, owner of the elevator facility. A display area is yet to be arranged for these items.

For all these activities and the efforts over the years by past and present Board of Directors, committees, Society members, and volunteers, I hope that a sincere "THANK YOU" can suffice to express to you the gratitude due you for your part in the past accomplishments.

And now we are moving into the second quarter century. Do we rest on our laurels? Or do we see the society as living, breathing and growing, thereby requiring our continued dedication, efforts, vision and support.

As we preview the second quarter century era of the society, we see:

1. A need for maintenance. Because of weathering and time, there is the need to refresh the building by painting and sealing. Continual landscaping is necessary. Parking areas require maintenance. Weatherproofing requires constant vigilance. Outdated, obsolete, or worn out equipment needs to be replaced.

2. A need for support. Receipts of funds, gifts, and donations are always welcomed and necessary for the continued life of the facility. But in order to make it a living history, volunteers and dedicated workers are

necessary:

(a) To repair and upgrade facilities

(b) To volunteer as living representatives of the life and times of the Windmill era

(c) To plan and facilitate the many activities sponsored throughout the year

3. A need for visionary planning. The first vision was to restore the Windmill. Then visions of the life, times and activities of the pioneers provided the desire to sponsor present day programs in an attempt to educate today's society about their historical heritage. We need to envision how we can expand our activities to recall the historical events, to provide human interest stories and provide for a legacy to pass forward to future generations.

We now see what was accomplished the first 25 years. For the next 25 years, we can only envision what we want for the Society, plan our preconceived ideas and dedicate our energy to accomplish our goals.

May you find joy in serving, giving and living for the Golden Historical Society.
