



New Membership Dues Changes In Effect

1. Membership year will run from January 1 through December 31 annually.

2. Two types of memberships: Individual and family

Individual: \$25.00 Annually (One person)

Family: \$40.00 Annually (Includes dependent children under 18)

- 3. Annual membership shall entitle members to receive certain defined benefits
 - A. Museum/Mill tours
 - B. 10% discount on gift shop items. May not be combined with sale prices or discounts
 - C. \$1 discount on member's dinners for Follies, Mystery Dinner Theatres and Heritage Days.

Discount only applies to full price meals.

Excludes food stand or other a la carte purchases.

D. Discount on entire Banquet Hall rental. Limited to 1 rental per year.

Individual Membership Discount: \$25 (Pro-rated for partial facility rental) Family Membership Discount: \$40 (Pro-rated for partial facility rental)

Limit one membership discount per membership year.

Cannot be combined with other discounts, promotional rates, or special rates.
