EMMINGA BANK/NEW ERA BUILDING IN GREAT DISREPAIR

This building is part of the Golden Historical Society. Since Joe Louderback had his train museum and memorabilia in this building, the building has set vacant and used for storage. We worked diligently and very hard to restore the Emminga Bank/New Era Building and to get it listed on the National Register of Historical Places. The building is falling into disrepair with windows broken and covered over with unsightly plywood. The interior plaster is falling off.

Permission has finally been obtained to run water and sewer lines to the building, electrical power will have to be reinstalled as well as some sort of heating source. **THIS CAN BE DONE!** We did it once, we can do it again. There are many ideas being talked about such as a tea shop/gift shop or museum annex. OR, we abandon it and put it up for sale.

This year marks the **21st Follies** Presentation, our main source of income.

Approx. **240 hours** go into the preparation of food for the Follies.

100+ volunteers are required to wait tables in the dining hall and clean up.

A Great Grand Niece of Harm Emminga’s, wife (Marie Gembler Emminga) visited our facilities in 2012

Clayton Work Camp supplies workers for general janitorial help, setting up tables/chairs for activities, decorating the complex with Christmas lights, grounds maintenance and other areas as needed. Their labor adds up to 450 + hours a year. We pay them by preparing a home-cooked meal and desserts.
